Transitional Housing

The YWCA of WNY offers transitional housing to homeless women and their children in apartments located throughout the region, including those reserved for women with a focus on women who are victims of domestic violence.

The program provides intensive one-on-one case management focused in providing the resources necessary for our clients to remove barriers on the journey to achieving empowerment and self-sufficiency.

Women may stay in the program anywhere from 6 to 24 months.

Housing for Low-Income Seniors

Providing safe and secure housing for low-income seniors, the School House Commons Senior Living Facility is located at 1005 Grant Street, near Amherst, in Buffalo.

School House Commons is home to 64 apartments and receives funding support from U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Section 202, Housing of the Elderly.

The complex is designated for elderly families. An elderly family is defined as a household where the tenant or co-tenant is at least 62 years old.
